## Thought of the week

The General election is finished, the votes are counted and the choice we have made is one which no one expected. The Conservative party will form the next government but it will be a hung parliament. Any democratic election is, by its very nature, about choice. We hold elections because it's the best way to agree when parties disagree. But I think we can take for granted how calmly we choose our government. People sometimes say that we're lucky to live in a democracy, but luck has nothing to do with it. Democracy is the achievement of those who have struggled so that we have the freedom to make that choice. Which is all the more poignant in this particular election which has been set against the back drop of terrorist attacks in Manchester and London. But despite the fear and intimidation that terrorists tried to bring about, democracy continues to be deeply rooted within the psyche of our nation. Religious faith involves a high degree of political responsibility. When Jesus asked his followers to love their neighbour as themselves, he described a politics where everybody was part of a mutually accountable community in which every citizen has a right and a duty to participate for the good of each and the good of all. On this Trinity Sunday we celebrate God revealed through interconnected relationships with the whole of creation. We are part of those relationships in which we are all accountable to each other and everyone has a share and responsibility for the good of the whole community, whoever we voted for. *Andrew*

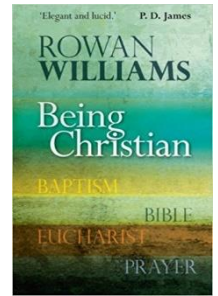
**Have a go at our word search based on the gospel reading for the day!**
