Thought for the week

Back to School!!

As soon as the schools had broken up for the Six Weeks, signs appeared in all the school outfitting shops and stationers, 'BACK TO SCHOOL'.


It seemed a particularly cruel trick to those of us who have children, that we should be reminded that the new school year was nearer than we cared to think. The shop slogans must work though, as my wife took our oldest daughter to a school outfitters in Cleethorpes this weekend in preparation for her transition to secondary school in September.

However, August is a holiday time and should be all about forgetting the existence of September especially if you are a teacher or a child. The word holiday comes from the Old English word *hāligdæg* "holy" + "day". Anything that is "Holy", is set apart. Sunday is a holy day because it is set apart (or should be). Saint Peter tells us in his first letter; But you are the ones chosen by God, chosen for the high calling of priestly work, chosen to be a holy people, God's instruments to do his work and speak out for him (1 Peter 2:9 MSG) Our holidays are precious to us because they are holy-days; set apart, different from the rest of the year. But, the recharging of batteries always has some purpose, and if you are entering a new school year, you should be at least be theoretically refreshed. Anyone who's been involved in teaching will know that there comes a point when the mind starts to turn to the new term, and to its possibilities. August becomes a sort of 'nursery' month where new ideas start to sprout for transplanting in the autumn. And so, it is for the church too. As minds start to unwind, new ideas take shape and new possibilities emerge.

My prayer is that during this holiday time, we all encounter something of the holy, become refreshed and inspired, ready for a new season with God. *Revd Mark Hutson*
