Thought for the week

Transfiguration is all about change. In the presence of God, Moses, Elijah and Christ are visibly altered. Initially the disciples want to hold onto the experience – build booths for the visitors, make it permanent, but the fleeting moment is one of change and now they will look at Jesus differently. Change is the goal of the Christian life. We come to God in our worship, asking that God will work in us, to change us into the people he knows we can become.

A quote that's often used by in communities that are facing change is "Become the change you want to see" in other words don't waste your time complaining that the world isn't quite as it should be, but change yourself and model by example how you would like it to become. Change, of course, needs action. We can't wait passively for the things just to happen. In the 1970's and 80's many Christian communities were experiencing

oppression in South America. Small groups read the bible together and acted to bring about the change and freedom they felt God wanted in the world. This is often called Liberation Theology, and it is a way of being the change they wanted to see. Today, we have a chance to do something similar. We are holding a Fairtrade stall at the Minster, kindly staffed by Ann Kennedy and helpers, you have a chance to buy simple everyday things like tea and coffee, that will make a real difference to people's livelihood and wellbeing in some of the poorest parts of the world. Buy buying these goods you will be the change we all want to see across the world, and in God good grace become transfigured.
