Thought for the week



THE Archbishop of Canterbury has called for a fundamental rethink of how our economy works. He has said that we need more public spending and higher taxes on technology giants and the wealthy. He has been a leading contributor to a major report by the Commission on Economic Justice which backs demands for a new regulator for technology firms, similar to those that oversee public utilities such as energy and water.

Its surprising to think that with the huge influence of social media companies that there is no regulator, and Justin Welby has said a new regulator should be tasked with ensuring that technology giants such as Google and Facebook were using people's personal data in a way that was socially responsible. Technology companies have enormous power and the use and handling of data has huge implications for people's security, but it also has huge implications for the flourishing of individuals and the prosperity and fairness of our society. If you corner the market in data, you have probably more wealth advantages than if you corner the market in gold or oil.

Archbishop Welby also argued for an increase in the minimum wage to better reflect the cost of living and support struggling families and said that without action, "bitter resentment" would grow.

Our church is engaging more and more with the commercial world and how Christians bring gospel values to that world is a real challenge. For example, the Minster's coffee shop is set up as a way of raising funds for the church, as well as offering hospitality to visitors. Our meals and care service at St Hugh's church is a charity trying to support vulnerable people in their own how, but it also seeks to generate funds to make its sustainable and allow its profits to be reinvested in the charity. These and other projects are part of our Christian service, but how we behave when we deal with business needs

thought and reflection. St John's gospel remind us that Christians are called to in the world, but not of the world. In other words, we are part of the busy, commercial, business of daily life, but our motive and values for doing this are focused of God's values not our own. Christian leaders like Justine Welby rightly have a major contribution to make the debate about how our economy works, and that as Christian we need make sure that the economy enable flourishing for all God's people – not just the few.


